And his reputation endured: long he died Sir Richard Baker wrote, in his Chronicles of the Kings of England of 1643, that Burbage and Edward Alleyn, the leader of the rival company, the Lord Admiral's Men, were 'two such actors that no age must look to see the like.'

But it wouldn't come cheap. The canny entrepreneur behind the scheme was the impresario James Burbage, the same who had built the Shoreditch Theatre in 1576, where Shakespeare had honed his craft. In the February of 1596 he sank £1,000 into the venture, a fortune at the time.
