John Singer Sargent (January 12, 1856 – April 14, 1925) John Singer Sargent (January 12, 1856 – April 14, 1925) was the most successful portrait painter of his era, as well as a gifted landscape painter and watercolorist. Sargent was born in Florence, Italy to American parents. Sargent studied in Italy and Germany, and then in Paris under Emile Auguste Carolus-Duran.

His international reputation reached its peak in the 1890s and early 1900s. At that time Sargent painted portraits of distinguished figures like Theodore Roosevelt, actress Dame Ellen Terry and author Henry James. By 1910 Sargent gave up portraiture and focused his attention on painting murals and landscapes.

John Singer Sargent in his studio with Portrait of Madame X, c. 1885 In the early 1880s Sargent regularly exhibited portraits at the Salon, and these were mostly full-length portrayals of women, such as Madame Edouard Pailleron (1880) (done en plein-air) and Madame Ramón Subercaseaux (1881). He continued to receive positive critical notice.

During Sargent's visit to the United States in 1890, Sargent and Saint-Gaudens decided to trade artistic tokens of their friendship. The sculptor created a portrait relief of Sargent's sister Violet playing the guitar, while Sargent painted this image of the sculptor's young son Homer (1880–1953) and wife Augusta (1848–1926).

Afterwards, he switched to charcoal, producing several hundred portraits of individuals recognized for their accomplishments in fields such as art, music, literature and theater.
